Deering Master Plan 2017 Adoption

The Deering Master Plan 2017 was adopted by the Deering Planning Board on July 12, 2017. The Plan includes ten chapters as well as an executive summary. Chapter topics include: Deering Today; Deering Tomorrow; Implementation; Historical and Cultural Resources; Housing; Natural Features; Community and Recreational Facilities with Utilities; Transportation; Existing and Future Land Use; and Regional Concerns.

Salisbury Master Plan 2017 Public Hearings

The Town of Salisbury is in the final stages of developing an updated Master Plan. To date, the Planning Board has held two public hearings on eight of the final draft chapters to be included in the Salisbury Master Plan 2017. The Planning Board plans to hold a third public hearing in August for the remaining chapters and hopes to adopt the completed Plan by the end of the Summer.

2017 CEDS Update Underway

The 2017 Central/Southern NH Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy committee met for a second time on June 29th. The meeting focused on developing an updated Strengths, Weakness, Opportunity, & Threats Analysis (SWOT). Next steps include soliciting priority projects. Allenstown Bosca wen Bow Bradford Canterbury During the afternoon of the 11th, members of DES, the nominating committee and the Rivers Management Advisory Committee (RMAC) participated in a tour of the Warner River. The group made several stops to view the river and talk about many of the resources outlined in the nomination document which is available on the RMPP section of the DES website. Following the tour, the public hearing began at 6:30 pm. The hearing was fairly well attended with roughly forty members of the public present. Several spoke in strong support of the project while others had specific questions.

If the level of public support determined by DES is sufficient, the DES commissioner will submit a legislative service request to amend RSA 483 to include the Warner River in the River's Management and Protection Program.
