Boscawen's Municipal Technical Assistance Grant Open House

On November 14th, the Town of Boscawen held an Open House as part of a grant received from Plan NH's Municipal Technical Assistance Grant Program. The grant is being used to engage the community in a discussion of the North Main Street/King Street Corridor prior to developing any recommendations or zoning changes along the Corridor.

The Open House was hosted by the owners of the Winthrop Carter House located on King Street within the Corridor. Over 40 people attended the meeting and there was lively discussion on topics such as land use, historic preservation, transportation, design standards, economic development and housing. Interviews of Corridor business leaders and residents were held earlier and the results of those interviews were shared with attendees. Next steps include summarizing all of the community input to date and continuing to involve the public in the identification of any potential recommendations to address issues and concerns.

CNHRPC Brownfields Assessment Program

For the months of October and November, the Brownfields Advisory Committee continued to move its current projects along. Phase II scopes of work were developed for Woods Woolen Mill in Hillsborough, Allied Tannery in Boscawen, and Naughton Landfill in Bradford. For Naughton, the Phase II sampling began in mid-November. Also, the 16 Clark Street Phase I site assessment in Pittsfield began in November. Moving into the new year, objectives will include working with NHDRED on their portion of the Woods Woolen Mill property, finishing the 16 Clark Street Phase I and finalizing the scopes of work for all Phase II's. Finally, CNHRPC will seek an additional assessment grant from EPA to continue work on these and other sites. A total of \$200,000 will be sought for hazardous waste and \$100,000 for petroleum. We look forward to moving this sites along in 2017!

CommuteS mart New Hampshire


Thank you to all of our CommuteSmart New Hampshire (CSNH) Season Long Challenge participants who logged smart commute trips from May 16 - October 31, 2016! Together, 72 participants logged 26,444 miles, 1,676 trips, using four modes of transportation including biking, walking, carpooling, and telecommuting. CSNH has recognized individuals and teams who participated with the following awards:

- <u>All-Star Commuter Award</u> awarded to individuals who logged a commute through all five months of the challenge.
- "Way to Go" Award awarded to individuals who logged at least twenty trips or significant amount of miles and were not recognized for the All-Star Commuter Award.
- Team Spirit Award awarded to teams with great member participation.
