<u>Topic:</u> Invasive Species in NH
<u>Speaker:</u> Douglas Cygan, Invasive Species Coordinator, NH Dept. of Agriculture

Mr. Cygan has been the Invasive Species Coordinator for the NH Department of Agriculture for the past 15-years as well as being a nursery inspector and an Authorized Certification Official for the USDA. Prior to this he was a Wetlands Permitting Officer for the NH Department of Environmental Services (DES) for 2-years, and before that he was a Senior Environmental Manager for the NH Department of Transportation's (DOT) Bureau of Environment for 7-years. In 1992 he graduated from the University of Maine, Orono, with a B.S and an A.S in Plant Science with a minor in Conservation Biology and Wetland Science. Mr. Cygan will provide an indepth look at upland invasive plant species of New Hampshire. Attendees will learn about the various issues, New Hampshire rules and regulations, characteristics, identifying features and control measures of some of the most aggressive non-native plants here in the Granite State.

Long Range Transportation Plan & Ten Year Plan Project Soliciting to Begin

CNHRPC will begin soliciting projects for inclusion in the CNHRPC Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) 2020-2040. During this time, CNHRPC will also be confirming that existing 2019-2028 NH Ten Year Plan (TYP) projects are still priorities and begin prioritizing unfunded projects for inclusion in the State's 2021-2030 Ten Year Plan in October.

In New Hampshire, each of the nine regional planning commissions prepares regional project priorities every two years based on input from local municipalities, NHDOT and each planning commission's Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC). This is concurrent with the New Hampshire Department of Transportation's (NHDOT) Ten Year Plan update.

She will discuss how housing policy affects local housing markets and general housing trends, and offer insight on housing affordability and first-time homebuyer issues. Peterson has helped catalyze the growth of ADUs in Portland, OR, and nationally through advocacy, education, policy work, and entrepreneurship.
