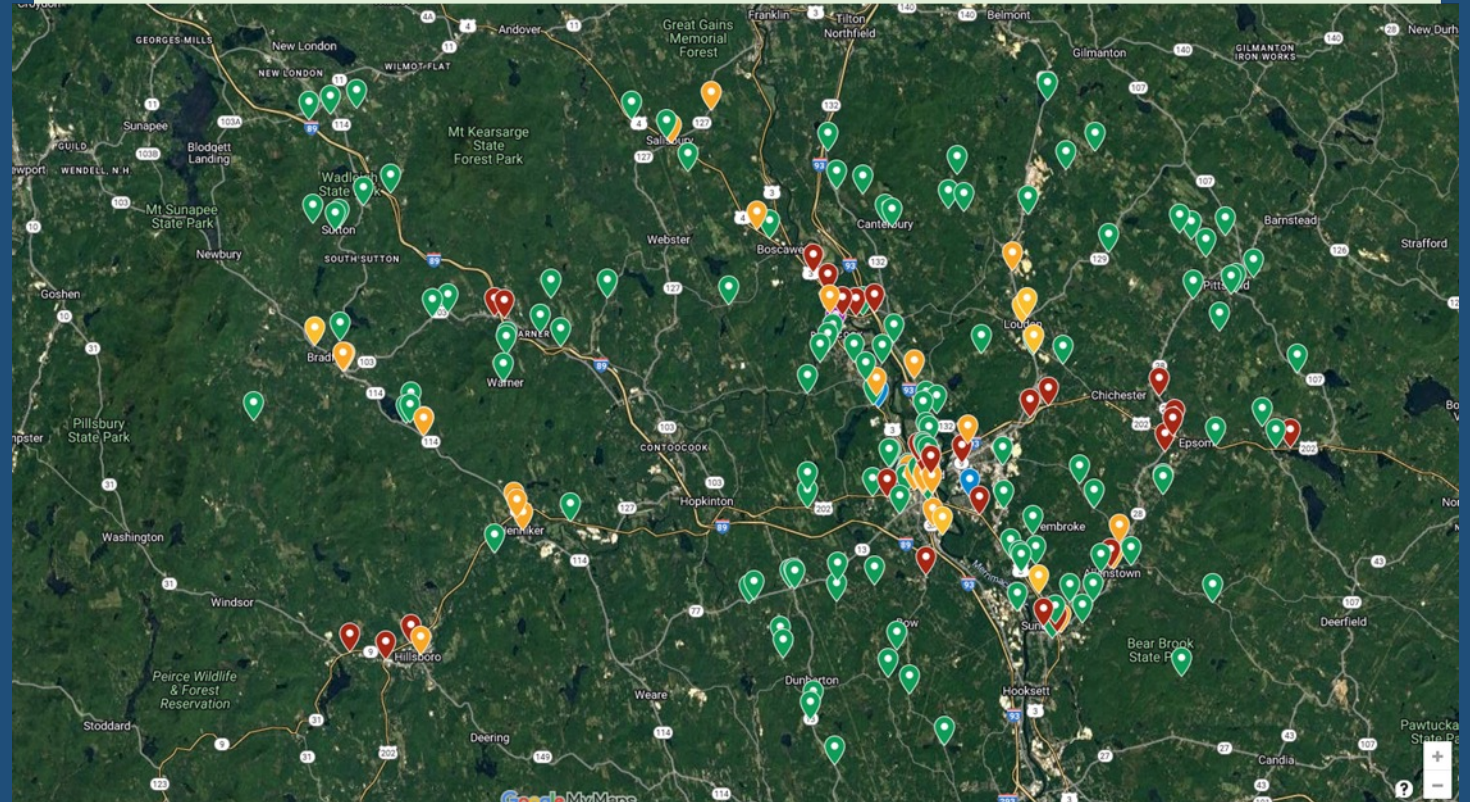

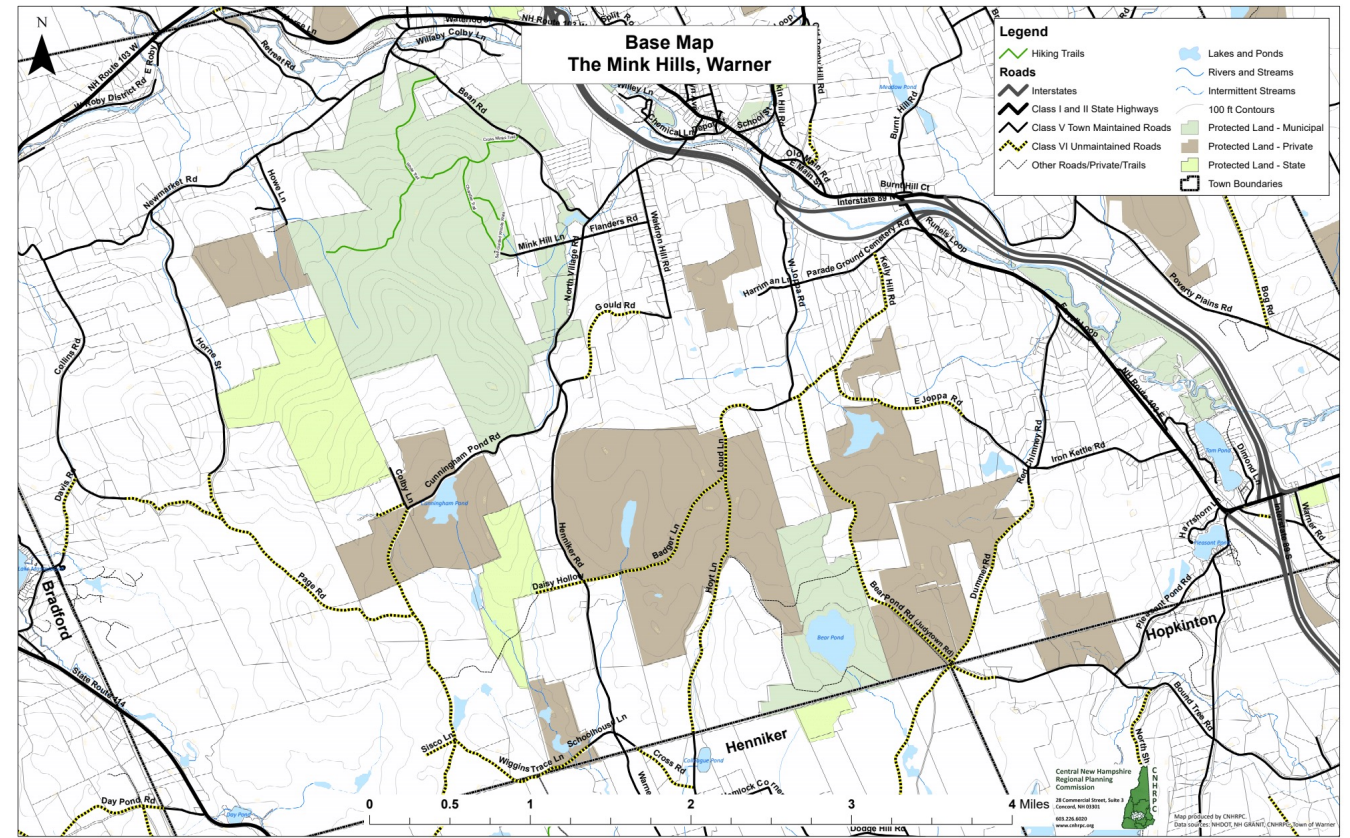
2022 State and Town Traffic Count Map – Over 200 Locations!

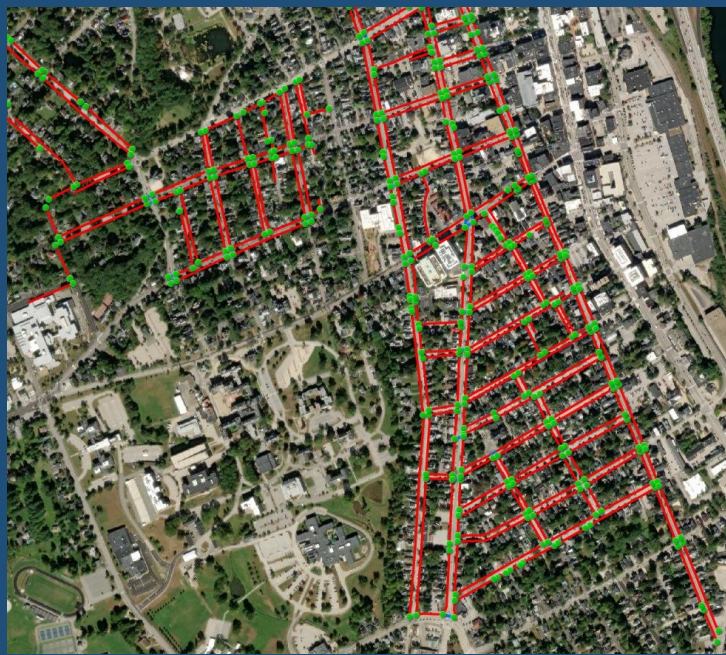

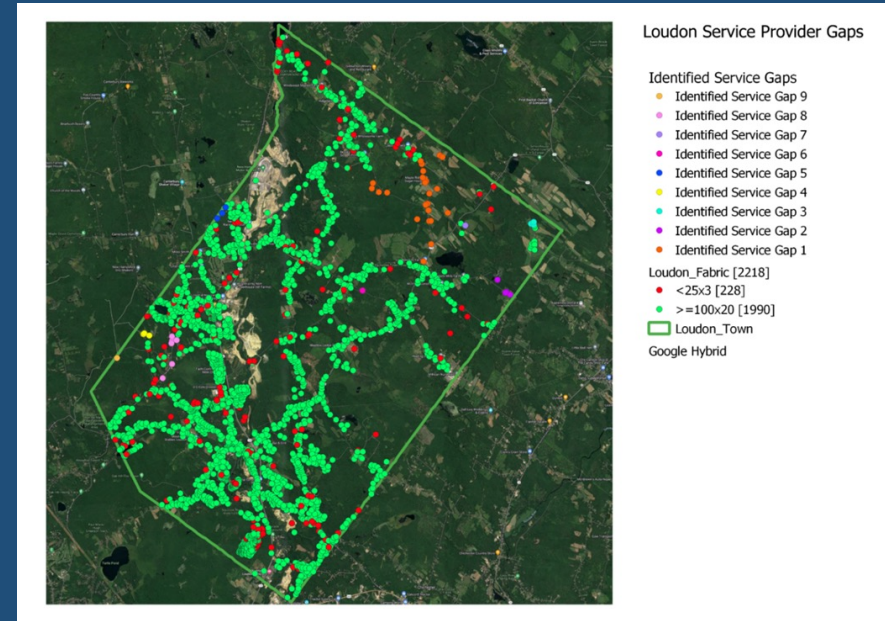

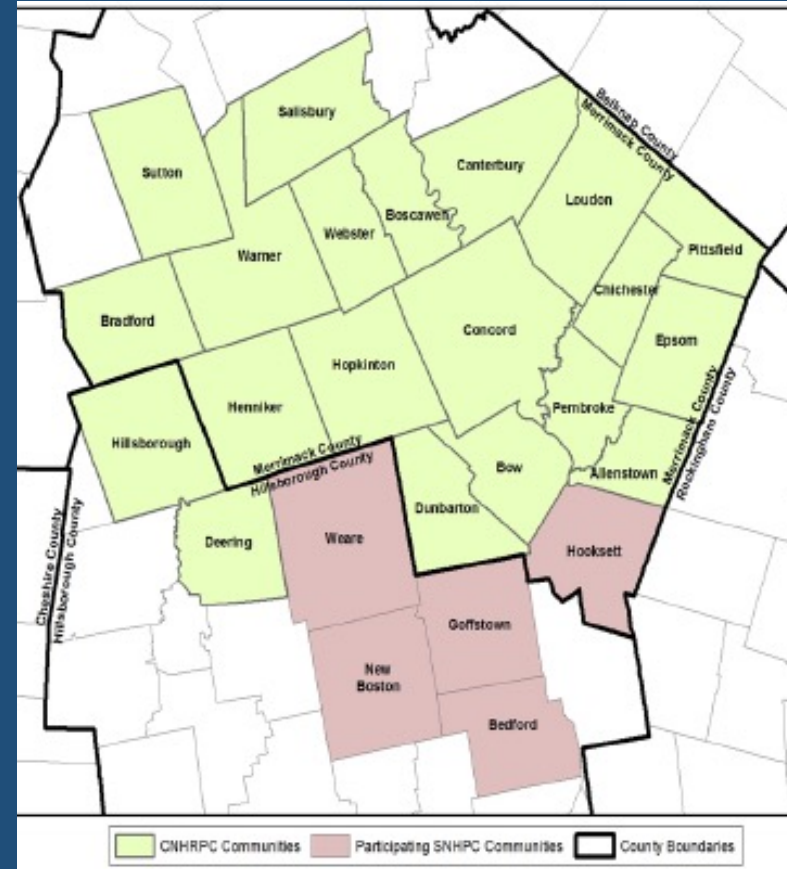
